1st BANGOR SCOUTS RECEIVE FUNDING FROM PAUL NEWMAN

The Bangor Scout Group has been selected to receive funding from Paul Newman (via the Newman's Own Foundation) as he celebrates 21 years of selling his products in Australia. It is expected that A\$1 million will be given away to over 70 groups before the end of the year.

The Bangor Scout Group received \$10,000 towards funding the attendance of the Scout Troop at the next Australian Jamboree (AJ2007) in January 2007 at Elmore in Victoria. The Jamboree, held once every three years, is a once-in-a-lifetime adventure for boys and girls aged 12 to 14 years and the Bangor Scouts raise money to help as many as possible to afford this educational opportunity. 2007 is also the centenary of the Scouting movement, so AJ2007 is shaping up to be one of the biggest Jamborees ever held.

Since founding his food company 23 years ago in the United States, Paul Newman has done nothing by the book. Every Christmas Paul bottled his favorite salad dressing in old wine bottles and gave it away to friends and neighbors. The idea blossomed into a thriving business that added other products along the way.

From day one Paul has given away all his profits after taxes to needy and worthy charities around the world. He is still amazed that a simple bottle of salad dressing was the genesis of US\$175 million being given away to charities since the company was founded in 1982, including over A\$8 million to organisations in Australia.

Paul has always relied on his own taste buds rather than focus groups and taste testers to develop a unique range of salad dressings and pasta sauces that have become very popular in the Australian market. Paul Newman's Own premium products are made in Australia and Australian charities will continue to reap the benefits of their growing sales and popularity.

Paul Newman's Own tagline is "Shameless Exploitation in Pursuit of the Common Good", an irreverent nod to the company's ethos. Donations are made to small but effective organisations that are often overlooked, as well as to larger organisations that are devoted to the sick, the elderly, education, the environment, children, the poor and needy - in fact any area that benefits the common good.
