On the Road Again

GETTING thousands of Scouts and Leaders around Sydney was always going to be an expensive and difficult task.

NSW's Minister for Transport and Roads, David Campbell MP, has agreed to approve free travel for all Scouts participating in the Jamboree for the duration of the event.

"Scouts may travel for free on CityRail services and regular route Sydney metropolitan bus services between 5 and 13 January, 2010," said Mr Campbell. "I would like to extend my best wishes to Scouts Australia for the 22nd Australian Jamboree and trust that the provision of free public transport will assist in making the event a success."

Scouts must present their individual identification tag to gain access to transport services and give priority to paying customers who are traveling by public transport.

Rescue Reunion

COINCIDENCES are something we are becoming used to at AJ2010. Today Senior Constable Colin Benton and Scout Daniel Murphy from 1st Bangor were reunited after last seeing each other at a dramatic event that occurred on December 23rd 2009.

Daniel was at an end of year Christmas celebration with his

Troop when he fell close to 4 metres off a cliff at Cronulla. He landed on a rock shelf, luckily as the next stop was the ocean, sustaining a broken arm and hip. Sen Con Benton and Sen Con Ian Cameron (not here at the Jamboree) walked him out on a stretcher after Daniel had been stabilised by Paramedics. Daniel's rescuer was thrilled to catch up,

as in his five years of working in the Police Rescue division he has never met back up with someone he has rescued.

Owing to his accident Daniel has been unable to attend Jamboree but was able to join in the fun on Visitors Day, even though he will be in a wheelchair for another 10 weeks.

His lesson learned from this experience? Don't run along a cliff edge in thongs.
